Techsauce is renowned for organizing the largest technology conference in Southeast Asia, the Techsauce Global Summit. Oranuch is dedicated to positioning Thailand as the tech gateway of Southeast Asia by creating platforms for opportunities, attracting investments, and enhancing the capabilities of Thai organizations, especially startups, to go international. She connects the Thai tech ecosystem with the global community, facilitates knowledge transfer, creates business opportunities through regional tech events, and develops new skills for the younger generation.

Beyond Techsauce, Oranuch serves as the General Partner at VentureBridge VC fund and cofounded Thailand Accelerator. She is a board member at Thailand's National Electronics and Computer Technology Center (NECTEC) and a committee member of the Digital Council of Thailand (DCT), contributing to the nation's digital transformation. Oranuch is passionate about leveraging technology to benefit society, particularly vulnerable groups such as refugees, children, women, the elderly, and people with disabilities. Her significant contributions have solidified her reputation as a key influencer in the Thai tech startup industry.

Prior to joining ADB, she worked at the African Development Bank as a resource mobilization expert and at the Treasury of France as a social economist and policy analyst.

Her dedication to advancing the global digital landscape is highlighted by her recent acceptance into the MIT Management Global Programs' IDEAS Asia Pacific Program. As Co-Founder and Chief Reputation Architect of GeiserMaclang, Amor continues to shape the future of digital economies and financial inclusion across Southeast Asia and beyond.
